The <u>Lowell Milken Institute-Sandler Prize for New Entrepreneurs</u> is a team business plan competition exclusively for UCLA students. The new venture can be a for-profit enterprise or a self-sustaining social

entrepreneurship. Teams must submit a written business plan for a new venture and, based upon those submissions, certain teams will make oral presentations to a panel of judges at an event open to the public. Each team must consist of between



two and six students and must include as one of its members either a law student who is graduating this academic year (JD, LLM or SJD) or a 2014 or 2015 graduate of the Law School as one of its members. The Competition Rules, FAQs and Resources for Teams are available on the <u>LMI website</u>.

CONGRATULATIONS TO KELLY ORIANS '15 ON RECEIVING A PRESTIGIOUS ECHOING GREEN FELLOWSHIP FOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

Kelly Orians was awarded a highly competitive <u>Echoing Green Fellowship</u> to help launch her community development corporation, <u>RisingFoundations</u> in New Orleans, Louisiana. RisingFoundations seeks to break the cycle of incarceration of black men by creating pathways for those released from prison to attain gainful employment, access to financial services and secure housing. Orians and her co-founder, Calvin Duncan, will receive \$90,000 in funding over two years, participate in leadership development events, and receive mentoring from leading business professionals. At UCLA Law, Kelly took courses in the Business Law Specialization and completed the David J. Epstein Program in Public Interest Law and Policy and the Critical Race Studies Program.
