# NETWORK WITH BUSINESS LAWYERS AT A BUSINESS LAW BREAKFAST

Each semester, the Institute hosts several <u>Business Law Breakfasts</u> featuring speakers on important current business law issues. It is an opportunity for students to learn about issues not often addressed in the classroom and meet with leading practitioners, including UCLA Law alums. The Business Law Breakfasts are held at the UCLA Faculty Center, a five minute walk from the law school.

On **Tuesday, September 18**, our first Business Law Breakfast will feature **UCLA Law Professor Kirk Stark**, the Barrall Family Professor of Tax Law and Policy. Professor Stark will discuss **California's Response to the New Federal Tax Law's Limits on Deductions for State and Local Taxes**. These new limitations will restrict California's tax payers' deductions on their federal tax calculations for payment of state income taxes. Professor Stark will share his analysis of proposed changes to California law to reduce the burden on California tax payers.



# ENGAGE WITH JUDGE SHIRA SCHEINDLIN (RET.) ON EQUALITY FOR WOMEN IN THE PROFESSION



As part of our commitment to advancing women in the legal profession, the Institute will host retired United States District Judge Shira Scheindlin on Tuesday, October 23 to discuss the New York State Bar Association's 2017 report, "If Not Now, When? Achieving Equality for Women Attorneys in the Courtroom and in ADR." Judge Scheindlin led the New York Bar's Commercial and Federal Litigation Section's Task Force on

Women's Initiatives that prepared the report.

The report documents a significant disparity in the number of female attorneys versus male attorneys who appear in speaking roles in federal and state courts in New York. And, there is every reason to believe the disparity is national. The report outlines actions that can be taken by the bench, the bar and clients to remedy this decades old disparity. Since the publication of the report, Judge Scheindlin has been speaking to

lawyers, bar associations, business people and law students throughout the country on achieving equity for women attorneys in the profession.

On the bench, Judge Scheindlin was known nationally for her pioneering decisions on electronic discovery and stop and frisk laws. She retired from the bench in 2016 and is now of counsel with the New York office of Strook, Strook & Lavan LLP.
